We love getting out to make great projects with the group each month.






# A Bisdee birthday

Everyone in aged care has the right to be safe, treated with dignity and respect, and receive high quality care and services. Person-centred care supports residents to be an active partner in their care.

Residents are encouraged to work with us to ensure the care they receive meets their needs, tell us their goals and which relationships and activities are important to them.

A lot of conversations are held about residents' preferences, their wishes, goals, what connections to people and their community are important to them.

At Glenview we support residents to make choices, understand the risks involved and work together to achieve these goals.

Residents are also able to have their family representative involved in the conversations, it is important that everyone involved has input and understands what is important to the resident.

Care Planning is an ongoing journey in partnership with residents, family representatives and staff.
