Dear all,

Derwent Room Café at Windsor

Thanks everyone for your patience as we work through how we can revitalize the café. The big issue of course, is funding the costs of operating a cafe.

Glenview is a not-for-profit organisation funded by grants from the Commonwealth Government who unfortunately do not provide us with any extra money to operate a café.

We've asked various volunteer groups and a high school training program to consider taking over the café, but unfortunately these good ideas weren't successful.

The café at Korongee is supported by each resident who pays a fee. In essence, the residents of the village pay for the operation of Korongee Café.

It seems that most of us want a vibrant café at Windsor.

We are exploring many options, but the decision ultimately rests on what **our residents and families want** to support.

Option one is to apply a fee, which would have to be supported by residents and families for it to be viable.

Charge each resident \$1 per day for Coffee Club membership. The **actual cost** per week would depend on the level of interest from residents and families.

In Option one, the café will ideally be open 3 hours for 3 days per week on Saturday, Wednesday and Friday for residents, family, and friends to enjoy.

A **Coffee Club** activity will be held each week for residents, and include **complimentary hot and cold beverages**.

We need to hear from you to decide if we can progress with this option.

Option two: No café in Windsor, thank you.

Option three: We are open to hear from **you** if you have any further thoughts or ideas to make the cafe a reality.

Karen will visit all Windsor residents and support them to provide their feedback.
