I bid a fond farewell to the residents and staff at Glenview as I head off on my next adventure and retire from Aged Care.


I thank all the people with dementia that I have met over the last thirty five years who have taught me so much.

Remember: people might not remember who you are or what you say, but they will ALWAYS remember how you treat them.



Windsor hot breakfast menu survey

In September we conducted a survey to identify preferred breakfast items that we could add to our menu. Participants were invited to select **all items** they would like to see offered. The survey was distributed to 80 residents, and 27 residents voted for one or more options.

The survey was open to all residents, regardless of their current breakfast habits, the results indicate a clear preference for traditional breakfast items. The options were:

Bacon and eggs 14 votes

Sausage and hash browns 14 votes

Pancakes and syrup 12 votes

Crumpets 10 votes

French toast 4 votes

Each week residents will choose if they would like a hot breakfast, currently they are offered every Tuesday.

The hot options will change weekly as with all menu choices.

Dear all

Parliament passed the Aged Care Bill on 25 November, which means the new **Aged Care Act** can start on **1 July 2025.**

This update is a big step for everyone connected to aged care – both those receiving care and services, and those providing those services. It paves the way for a better system that puts the rights and needs of older people first.

As the year comes to a close, we have also received advice that the Fair Work Commission has approved a further increase for aged care employees.

We have seen two significant wage increases over the past 12 months, focusing primarily on care workers (house companions) and nurses.

While this is undoubtedly well-deserved recognition for those Glenview team members, it left a lot of our team without a wage increase including activities officers, cleaners, laundry staff, food services assistants, maintenance staff, gardeners, bus drivers, and administrative and reception staff.

This latest announcement from the government is terrific news not only for these staff but more generally to attract people to work in aged care and support the growing need to provide care for older Australians.

In December, we will celebrate the **first** anniversary of Waratah House at Windsor, the first facility of its kind in Tasmania.

Waratah provides individualised care for people who are experiencing severe behavioural and psychological symptoms of dementia (BPSD) and are unable to be adequately cared for in a standard residential aged care setting. The Waratah care team aim to enable residents to move on to a less intensive care setting over time.

In the first year, we've celebrated some excellent positive outcomes for residents and their families.

It was wonderful to experience the **Christmas markets** at Windsor and Korongee, which were supported by local businesses and community members.

A huge thank you to Priceline Pharmacy, Australia Post, Scoopy Doo Icecream Van, Feet 2U, With Sugar on Top, Island Resin, Maree Morgan, Penny Hardman and Kim and Judy Gillies.

I look forward to seeing you at one of the Christmas events over the next few weeks.

May the Christmas Season bring only happiness and joy to you and your family.
