What is the VEU?

Voluntary Enforceable Undertaking

To assess if Glenview provides the quality standards of service set by the Aged Care and Quality Commission, the whole organisation was audited in the middle of 2024.

The Commission found areas that needed improvement to comply with the quality standards and offered Glenview a Voluntary Enforceable Undertaking (VEU) agreement. It gives us time to work closely with the Commission and ensures we undertake key improvements across our nursing homes. The VEU means that we have volunteered to improve our services.

A summary of the undertakings that Glenview is committed to include:

- Additional face-to-face education for staff
- A review of our incontinence practices to ensure we meet individual needs
- Development of an overall quality, safety and clinical risk framework with regular reporting and
- Development of a high-risk resident framework to guide the oversight of residents identified as high-risk.
- Improvement of our behaviour support plan process to minimise the use of restrictive practices.
- Continue to refine our workforce planning and review workforce data to support ongoing improvement work.
- The VEU does not impact our Community Services home care or Bisdee day and respite care. Both of these services are fully compliant and have three years of accreditation.

Dear all

Happy New Year!

We've already started planning for the year with several big-ticket items on the agenda for the next 12 months.

It will be a year of consolidation with a couple of themes that we will continue to work through, including our objective to return to full compliance with the Quality Commission by the end of June.

We held four forums in December, two for staff and two for residents and representatives to help communicate the process we need to follow to achieve this.

We are well underway in working through our plan for improvement and would like to thank those families, representatives, and residents who were able to attend one of the meetings. We will keep you informed through the Glenview News and our monthly resident and relative forums.

Minutes of these meetings are shared in each area of the home, in reception and are emailed to next of kin contacts.

We plan to continue with our refurbishment program at Windsor Street, which will focus on completing the refurbishment of the Merton wing that started last year with a balcony upgrade.

We hear from residents that they would like us to pay attention to the old Merton garden area to make this more accessible. We are reviewing this as part of our planning for the year. Another essential

improvement at Windsor is the heating and cooling system. Work is required to increase the comfort of residents, visitors, and staff. The modifications will also generate energy efficiency and environmental gains.

This year, the board will thoroughly review the Glenview Strategic Plan 2022 - 2025. It's a perfect time to consider the implications of the new Aged Care Act across service areas and some of the most significant reforms in delivering care and services to older Australians, for 30 years.

A key component of our strategic direction will be a considerable focus on our workforce. It is a big subject, and it sounds self-evident but without educated, supported, motivated and caring people, we can't deliver on the Glenview purpose - life as you define it.

Key areas to support our workforce include ways to improve our career development opportunities, improve levels of communication and staff education.

We will set up an advisory group to ensure that we include our consumer's voices in the future of their care, services and support for Glenview over the next 3 to 4 years.

More information about the advisory group and work on the review will follow in the coming months.
