Korongee news

Resident and Representatives Meetings are now held via ZOOM for representatives at 2.00pm every second Tuesday of the month.

At the 21.01.25 meeting, Pauline Gibb was introduced as the new Consumer Advisory Board rep for Korongee. Welcome Pauline!

CLINICAL NOTES AND STAFF

An updated nursing structure was sent by text to reps on 05.02.25. Nurses will work more in the houses and provide training to house companions, along with reps from Dementia Support Australia. Nurses have completed face to face education in continence and dementia care, and incident management. A copy of each resident's care plan will be provided to their rep and it will be reviewed every 6 months, earlier if required. In January, a dietician began working with residents experiencing weight loss. Applicants are now being interviewed to appoint a Wellbeing and Engagement Coordinator at Korongee.

MAINTENANCE

Butler cul-de-sac irrigation system has been assessed and will have new sprinkler heads installed. The watering timer will be changed to water early in the morning, and the area will be replanted. The Community Centre door suffered wind damage and is now repaired. An alternative is still being considered, such as a sliding door.

A pothole in the driveway is to be repaired, the dead pines have been removed along the driveway and the top area has had a clean up.

COMMUNICATION AND ENTRY

Please use the communication books in each house and at reception, to advise us if a resident is going out for a meal and doesn't require one to be prepared.

Residents returning after 7.30pm enter their house with their lanyard.

MEALS

The informal Food Focus groups for residents began on 13 February. A new van is in operation for food delivery to maintain quality. Two extra staff are now rostered on at lunchtime to assist residents, if required.

Some meals and desserts are being cooked in the houses and served at teatime by the house companions. Residents are asked what they would like to cook and so far have made tacos, jacket potatoes and Eton mess.


Plans are afoot to make pizza on Sunday nights and hot breakfasts on Saturdays.

NOTICES

Meeting attendees agreed to be known as residents, rather than as a consumer or older person.

It has been reported to the taxi company that residents have issues with taxi drivers who don't get out of their cars, or put walkers into their boot. In some instances, drivers have driven off.

Residents are reminded that laundry is washed on Monday to Friday. Allow two business days for clean items to be returned.

CLINICAL INFORMATION AND SESSIONS

An information session about the Voluntary Enforceable Undertaking (VEU) with the Aged Care and Quality Commission was held for residents on 14 January at 2pm in the Derwent Room. Standard Wise consultants are assisting staff to ensure all residents have a current behaviour support plan.

Staff have received education in continence care to prevent UTIs and dermatitis, and education about how to recognise clinical incidents.

House Companions are being provided with mentoring and education from the clinical team. Glenview will provide the required reports and meet with the Commission once a month.

A pharmacist from the Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission will present a session on 19 February at 3pm in the Derwent

Room to encourage residents to be active in healthcare decisions.

The session includes medication management training undertaken by our staff, why staff may suggest a reduction in medication, and why dipsticks to detect urinary tract infections may become less frequent.

In January, a dietician started working with residents who are experiencing significant weight loss.

Clare congratulates everyone for their hard work in containing Covid when residents became unwell on Christmas eve. RATs are not required for visitors or staff at Windsor.

ENVIRONMENT

Our maintenance team are looking at repurposing the Merton garden for resident access as it is not suitable for use by the Waratah unit. Hedges and blackberries were trimmed at the request of residents and the garden contractor is assessing the rose garden at the entrance of Glenview. Two possums near Merton were relocated off site. The Japanese Garden bridgework and re-establishment of the garden beds is coming along well.

In February, Glenview provided the first milestone of reporting to the Quality Commission under the **Voluntary Enforceable Undertaking** (VEU).

Significant progress was reported against each of the individual undertakings. Positive feedback from staff highlights the benefit of face-to-face training, and the continence training programs delivered in January are already seeing positive outcomes in relation to resident care.
